

TRASH COMPACTOR

What type of materials should be disposed of in the trash compactor? Discarded food items/ waste and packaging; food-soiled cardboard, paper towels, paper and waxed paper; plastic and/or vinyl gloves; Styrofoam (e.g., coffee cups, plates, bowls); twist ties; rubber bands; wire; twine; rope; bathroom paper waste; personal hygiene products; band-aids; tape; fabric; plastic plates, forks, knives, and spoons; cigarette butts; and gum. **Household trash should be bagged and placed in trash bags not to exceed 55 gallons.** If the item is large, hard, bulky, and/or does not compact well it should be disposed of in the Open Top Roll-off Container.

Unacceptable materials include:

- Hazardous or toxic substances including poisons, pesticides, acids, caustics, paints, glues, gasoline, propane tanks, motor oil and other flammable substances
- Explosives/ammunition
- Infectious/medical wastes
- Other hazardous or dangerous materials
- Dead animals
- Yard waste, including soil, rocks, sod, tree trunks, limbs or stumps, resulting from tree removal
- Parts of motor vehicles (including heavy scrap metal and tires)
- Materials resulting from building remodeling, repair or construction, including bricks, blocks, cabinets, concrete in any form, doors, lumber, non-metal fencing, windows (including storm doors and storm windows and screens), shingles, gutters, plaster and plasterboard.

OPEN-TOP ROLL-OFF CONTAINER

What type of material should be disposed of in the Open-Top Roll-off container? If the material is hard, bulky, does not fit into a trash can or bag, and/or does not compact well then it should be disposed of in the Open-Top Roll-Off container. **Please do not place your household trash into this container as it remains an open invitation for wildlife to access.**

Acceptable materials include:

- Ironing boards
- Garden hoses
- Cue sticks
- Baby pools and pool liners
- Canoe paddles
- Lamps
- Vertical blinds
- Carpet/rugs (please roll and tie)
- Carpeting Padding (please roll and tie)
- Box springs/mattresses
- Nonmetal (plastic/porcelain) sinks
- Nonmetal laundry trays
- Nonmetal shower stalls
- Nonmetal toilet bowls
- Cribs, infant bath tubs, changing tables
- Doors
- Head/foot boards
- Ladders
- Playpens
- Bicycles, Tricycles and large toys
- Luggage
- Cabinets
- grills

Unacceptable Materials Include:

- hazardous or toxic substances including poisons, pesticides, acids, caustics, glues, paint, gasoline, propane tanks, motor oil, other flammable substances
- explosives/ammunition and other hazardous materials
- medical/infectious wastes
- dead animals
- yard waste including soil, rocks, tree trunks, limbs or stumps resulting from tree removal
- parts of motor vehicles (including heavy scrap metals and tires)
- white goods/major appliances
- E-waste – computers, modems, keyboards, printers, scanners, cables, computer mice, televisions, monitors, telephones, fax machines, copiers, toner cartridges, vcr's, tape players, stereo equipment, radios, cd's radios, cell phones, power cords, compact fluorescent bulbs and batteries and small household appliances including microwaves, blenders, food processors, toasters, vacuums, coffee makers, Christmas lighting, etc.
